FROM THE NURSE

We hope your summer was a healthy one. Please complete the 2011-2012 emergency form that your student receives the first day of school and return to the nurse's office as soon as possible. This will ensure all medical information is up to date in the health office.

If your student requires prescription medication at school, please contact the nurse's office for information and paperwork.

Students may carry their own Epi Pens or inhalers at school if their physician has deemed it safe. Paperwork from the doctor **MUST** be on file in the

nurse's office in order to have a student carry his or her Epi Pen or inhaler. All medication orders MUST be renewed for each school year.

All 7th graders MUST have a current physical and updated immunization record in order to attend school.

7th and 10th grade screenings will begin in the near future. The screenings will include: height, weight, BMI, vision and hearing. All results will be mailed home to parents/guardians. Postural screenings will be performed for students in grades 7, 8 and 9.

If you do not want your student to be screened, please submit a request in writing to the nurse's office.

PSAT'S FOR JUNIORS

Mark your calendars now! PSAT's will be given to juniors on **Wed., Oct. 12, 2011 , beginning at 7:50 a.m.. This will be the second year that we will offer to administer the PSAT on a school day. Last year this change resulted in a significant increase in the number of students who elected to take the exam. Registration for the PSAT will begin on September 19th. The deadline for sign-ups is October 4th.** The test takes all morning. Sophomores are welcome to take the test however, parents/guardians should be aware that for most 10th

graders it can be very discouraging since the test includes a great deal of information that has yet to be covered by a student's sophomore year.

It is recommended that all students take the SAT's twice. Research shows that taking the test a third time most likely will not increase scores and in fact, in most cases, students will see a lower score.

GROUP COUNSELING

Guidance is again offering a group-counseling program at HRHS. The aim of these groups is to help students improve their interpersonal skills, learn self-responsibility, build self-esteem, and for many, increase their connections to peers and engagement with school. Group members typically represent all elements of the HRHS student body.

Group counseling experiences have had a significant impact on many students over the years as is reflected in the comments from previous group members:

"Group has been awesome. A safe place where anyone and everyone can voice their frustration and fears! It's nice to not feel alone with my struggles. I like to call it structured venting or venting with structure."

These groups can be of great benefit to students who experience some level of difficulty managing the social and emotional experiences of middle and high school. If you feel your son or daughter would benefit from one of these groups or if you have any questions, contact please: Jan Sniffen, Adjustment Counselor; or Katie Watkins, Middle School Guidance Counselor.

Possible Group Options:

#1---**Middle School boys** who tend to be more isolated, seem to have few friends, perhaps lack

social skills or are (potential) targets for bullying or harassment. The group is an opportunity to experience increased peer support and acceptance, make more or new connections and improve coping and social skills.

#2---**Middle School Girls** who would benefit from talking with same age peers about issues that can affect adolescent girls. Students may need assistance with learning how to voice feelings and concerns in a constructive and healthy way, form good relationships and increase responsibility for their choices in life.

#3---**High School girls and boys** who would benefit from, or be a benefit to, other students, (role models) for co-ed groups. Students who most benefit from this particular group model generally do not suffer from serious mental health issues, but need the support of a weekly skills based support group. The group is an opportunity to experience increased peer support and acceptance, make more or new connections and improve coping and social skills.
